





The Kentucky River is a historically, economically, and recreationally valuable part of Central Kentucky.

Its ancient course runs in a north westerly direction, draining 7,000 square miles of land wholly contained within the state of Kentucky.

Today over 700,000 people depend on the Kentucky River for drinking water.

In its last stretch before it reaches the Ohio River, the Kentucky River runs through the state capital of Frankfort and is fed by Benson Creek, Elkhorn Creek, Eagle Creek, Cedar Creek, and Drennon Creek.

This area, known as the lower Kentucky River watershed, encompasses over 600 square miles of land primarily in Franklin, Owen, and Henry counties.

The lower KY River watershed is unique in its large blocks of forestland—rare for this region—and its long, beautiful tributaries.

Woods and Waters Land Trust's mission to protect natural lands in the lower Kentucky River watershed contributes to the long term stability of the river system and its myriad of benefits.



Placing your land in trust permanently protects it from development while preserving its natural features.

Your heirs will enjoy lower inheritance taxes and you will be eligible to apply for tax breaks.

of protected land:

- Enhances water quality
- Improves air quality and reduces CO2 and greenhouse gases
- Reduces the potential for flooding
- Provides habitat for many species of wildlife including migratory species
- Provides habitat for rare and endangered plants such as Braun's rockcress and globe bladderpod
- Preserves scenic views
- Preserves land for recreation and sustainable agriculture.
